PASTOR'S DESK

We continue to reflect on Pope Francis recent teaching document on holiness. After assuring us that holiness is not only for the beatified and canonized but that we should look for the "Saints Next Door," he reminds us that all of us are called to holiness. Quoting the Second Vatican Council, he writes: "Strengthened by so many and such great means of salvation, all the faithful, whatever their condition or state, are called by the Lord-each in his or her own way-to that perfect holiness by which the father himself is perfect."

In the past and even today, we used to refer to that call as a vocation and over time it came to mean a call to the priesthood or the religious life. Pope Francis is saying that the call or vocation to holiness comes to each one of us. "The important thing is that each believer discern his or her own path, that they bring out the very best of themselves, the most personal gifts that God has placed in their hearts."

The Holy Father elaborates: "To be holy does not require being a bishop, a priest or a religious. We are frequently tempted to think that holiness is only for those who can withdraw from ordinary affairs to spend much time in prayer. This is not the case. We are called to be holy by living our lives with love and bearing witness in everything we do wherever we find ourselves."

Quoting the bishops of New Zealand in their teaching document "Healing Love" Francis embraces their message: "...that we are capable of loving with the Lord's unconditional love, because the Risen Lord shares his powerful life with our fragile lives." Thus each Christian is on a "mission," a path to holiness. "It consists in uniting ourselves to the Lord's death and Resurrection in a unique and personal way..." "But it can also entail reproducing in our own lives various aspects of Jesus' earthly life: his hidden life, his life in community, his closeness to the outcast, his poverty and other ways in which he showed self-sacrificing love."

Thus we are called to be contemplatives even in the midst of action communing with the Lord, constantly growing in our friendship with him, nurturing a spirit of holiness capable of filling both our solitude and our service.

"You are strangers and aliens no longer. No you are fellow citizens of the saints and members of the household of God." (Eph: 2:19)

CARDINAL'S VISIT

Cardinal Sean wrote of his visit here on April 15 in his blog:

"Sunday I visited Our Lady of Sorrows Parish in Sharon. Fr Frank Daly has been there for about a year and he was anxious for me to come out to the parish and get to meet the parishioners.

It was a lovely visit and I found it to be a very diverse and vibrant parish. The people there have a very strong sense of interfaith outreach, particularly to the Jewish community in the area. I was very glad to have had the opportunity to visit them."

FR O'DONNELL

Fr John O'Donnell died on March 21, 2018 and served here at OLOS as a newly ordained priest from 1963-1969. His PILOT obituary observed: "He also loved to weave recollections from his various assignments starting with what seemed like his favorite, his first assignment at Our Lady of Sorrows in Sharon."
